

Build connections to other software with FMX's API

With FMX's API, your organization can create connections to the software you use every day. These connections, or integrations, allow FMX to push information to your organization's other software systems, and vice versa.

Without proper integrations in place, your team may find itself manually connecting data and touchpoints between systems. Consequently, the software you implemented to save time may actually be costing time.

Software integrations ensure your organization maintains high levels of efficiency and productivity by allowing data to seamlessly move back and forth between systems.

FMX's API has been used to build connections with many systems including:

- Internal, custom-built systems
- Event scheduling and calendaring systems
- Invoicing systems
- Enterprise Resource Planning Systems (ERPs)
- Asset and inventory management systems
- Access control and building automation systems
- Sensors and other IoT devices

Capabilities of FMX's API

Work Requests (Maintenance Requests, Technology Requests, Custom Modules)

- Receive information about work requests
- Create new work requests
- Delete work requests
- Update work requests with new information

Equipment

- Receive information about equipment
- Create new equipment
- Delete equipment
- Update equipment with new information

Schedule Requests

- Receive information about schedule requests and schedule request occurrences
- Create new schedule requests
- Delete schedule requests

Inventory

- Receive information about inventory
- Update inventory with new information

Planned Maintenance

- Receive information about instruction sets, tasks, and occurrences
- Resources and Locations
- Receive information about resources

Transportation Requests

- Receive information about transportation requests
- Delete transportation requests

Users

- Receive information about users

Buildings

- Receive information about buildings

Attachments

- Receive information about attachments
